

## Worship for Sunday, February 4

• Mark 1: 29-39

• The Psalter reading is Psalm 147

Jesus begins ministry right away. In the midst of all of Jesus' teachings and healings, and a battle with evil, Jesus takes time to pray. Prayer empowers us for our ministries. Taking time to pray is an attitude, an attitude of deliberateness. We must be deliberate about sharing our burdens and thanksgiving with God in prayer wherever we find ourselves. I urge you to make time for that solitary, quiet place within your mind, within your temperament. Find that "somewhere" place where you can be alone with God in prayer. One place that I appreciate in our church facility is the meditation chapel just off the walking track. I often go there as I begin my day at the office. I also find myself there after discovering a specific congregational need for pray. Regardless of where you pray, the important thing is that you make a place for prayer in your heart.
